And then there is also Hatch Pond – you can read about the latest ARCH project to reinstate the Art Interpretation board in your AGM report on page 6-7 with an invitation to come and hear about the History of Hatch Pond at the next Residents coffee morning on June 26th in the Canford Heath Library. Hatch Pond has had over 145 species of bird recorded there over the last 20 years.

Canford Heath was also the recent go-to area for birders to get a rare sighting of the Waxwings that were seen near ASDA having not visited this area since 2012 – even the birds realise how special Canford Heath is.

The AGM brochure includes my Chairs Report all on the events, meetings, projects and communications that ARCH has been involved in since the last AGM. The information is there for you to read on all the tasks we have done. So this morning I'm not going to read that out but instead I want to focus on the people that make it all happen. And that is us, the residents of Canford Heath.
